GKC wins AKC Community Achievement Award - With \$1000 prize

The American Kennel Club® announced recently that the Greenville Kennel Club (GKC) of Greenville, South Carolina has been named a recipient of the AKC® Community Achievement Award for hosting an exceptional AKC Responsible Dog Ownership (RDO) Day event. The GKC received one of three awards for the fourth quarter of 2008— Trap Falls Kennel Club and Upper Potomac Valley Kennel Club also received recognition.

Recognizing that they are an ambassador for purebred dogs in their community, members of the Greenville Kennel Club with AKC RDO Committee Chair Chuck Floyd set the goal of introducing their community to a wide range of AKC activities and to educate and positively influence all of the dog-loving attendees.

Local city officials proclaimed September 27th to be "AKC Responsible Dog Ownership Day" in Greenville. The club worked with local groups such as the Greenville County Recreation Department and other dog clubs to offer many events intended to introduce the public to dog sports such as agility, rally, obedience, AKC CGC, working dog sport and drafting demos. The Greenville County Sheriff's Office also demonstrated drug seizure and apprehension exercises, and Greenville Technical College shared their Grooming and Small Animal Care programs with demonstrations of proper nail and coat care.

"AKC congratulates the members of the Greenville Kennel Club for working to distinguish themselves as the leading authority on purebred dogs in their community," said Noreen Baxter, AKC's VP of Communications. "Their outstanding AKC RDO Day event demonstrates the club's knowledge and willingness to educate local dog owners about how to be responsible, and we hope that local officials will use them as a resource in the future."

We would like to send out a very big THANK YOU to all the Members of the GKC that assisted with our planned activities for the Responsible Dog Ownership Day 2008. We made a tremendous splash in the community with our efforts to bring as many differing opinions and ideas together to promote responsible dog ownership in the upstate. As a result of our efforts we have not only built a bridge but opened a responsible dialogue with other pet enthusiast in the upstate. This bridge will assist all responsible dog owners in the future.

-- AKC Humane Fund Founding Members Wall of Honor Unveiled at AKC Open House --

Next month visitors to the American Kennel Club's Open House will be among the first to see the AKC Humane Fund "Founding Members Wall of Honor." The Wall occupies a prominent place in the executive offices of AKC's Corporate Headquarters in New York City situated between the offices of the Chairman of the Board and the Executive Secretary among AKC's collection of fine canine art.

So far, names of more than 115 individuals, 25 AKC clubs, and 20 corporations and organizations will appear on the Wall. Their generous gifts of \$1,000 or more have earned them a place in history as founding members. Open House attendees can see the names of those who demonstrated a leadership role in establishing the Fund between the hours of 12 noon and 4 p.m. on Sunday, February 8.

The AKC Humane Fund's mission is to unite a broad spectrum of animal lovers in promoting the joy and value of responsible dog ownership through education, outreach and grant-making. Fund programs planned for the future include helping support our parent clubs' rescue activities; administering a Hall of Fame for the sport of purebred dogs; assisting human services organizations that permit domestic abuse victims to enter and stay in shelters with their pets; providing resources to programs that educate adults and children about responsible dog ownership; and contributing to organizations that support the fund's mission including the AKC Canine Health Foundation, AKC Museum of the Dog, and AKC Companion Animal Recovery.

There is still time to have a plaque included on the wall to honor your own participation in the sport or as a way to pay tribute to a relative, friend, club or dog. The AKC Humane Fund, Inc. is a non-profit charitable organization and contributions are tax deductable as allowed by law.
