American Kennel Club and AKC Canine Health Foundation Debut Podcast Series

- Topics highlight Breeders Symposia and CHF grant recipients -

RALEIGH, NC – The American Kennel Club and the AKC Canine Health Foundation are pleased to debut their new podcast series, featuring lectures from the highly successful AKC-CHF Breeders Symposia. Future podcasts will also provide responsible breeders and pet owners an inside look at the work being done by the AKC and the AKC Canine Health Foundation.

Launched four years ago by the AKC and the AKC CHF, the Breeders Symposia target novice and expert breeders alike. They offer an ideal opportunity to learn about sound breeding practices and advances in genetic health tests. Presentations include basic and applied genetics, anatomy and physiology, breeding techniques and updates on the AKC and the AKC Canine Health Foundation. The podcasts will feature leading scientists and researchers who have spoken at AKC-CHF Breeder Symposia as well as CHF grant recipients. New podcasts will be released every two weeks and can be accessed from either the [American Kennel Club](#) website or the [AKC Canine Health Foundation](#) website – click on “Podcasts.” They will also be available on Apple’s iTunes®.

Currently posted podcasts are:

- Matthew Ellinwood DVM, PhD discussing how the field of genetics can assist in developing the tools necessary for responsible breeders.

- Sharon Center DVM talks about the research being done to correct some common genetic liver disorders.

“The podcast series will be the AKC Canine Health Foundation’s audio portal to exciting presenters, researchers, and investigators demonstrating their expertise and experience in the fight against canine health disorders and disease,” states Cindy Vogels, president of the AKC Canine Health Foundation. “AKCCHF-funded researchers and experts will offer their keen insight and findings on research studies involving those diseases which are of greatest concern to the dog-owning and breeding communities and we’re proud to feature them in this way.”

“The American Kennel Club is pleased to support both the Breeders Symposia and the podcast series, which will enable anyone interested in better breeding to access this important information,” states Ron Rella, the American Kennel Club’s Director of Project Administration. “Future podcasts will include overviews of AKC initiatives such as Public Education, Companion Animal Recovery, Government Relations, and Veterinary Outreach among others. We hope to offer an ‘inside view’ of the AKC and its outstanding programs and services which truly make us the ‘dog’s champion.’”

Legislative Updates

SB833 (the anti tethering and crating bill) has been sent back to recommittee and is currently considered "dead". However, with elections coming up soon, it is possible that it will reappear. Link to the latest version of the bill is at: http://www.scstatehouse.net/sess117_2007-2008/bills/833.htm

- Cary NC council members are currently looking into mandating a mandatory spay/neuter or \$100 altered pet permit ordinance.
- HB5010 (pit bulls and designation of other breeds as dangerous) has also been sent to the judiciary committee but as above, will probably reappear in the next session.
- Anderson SC dangerous breed ordinance (Under the proposed ordinance existing pit bulls must have a fenced yard, you must be at least 18 year old to walk the dog, and it must have a muzzle on its mouth. Also, owners must have a \$1,000.00 dollar insurance policy. Also, pit bulls must have their tags and shots.) On 4/28/08, the council appointed a committee to further research.
- Dillon city council passed and approved an ordinance on 5/12/2008, that defines pit bulls as dangerous (it also includes dogs that look like Am Staffs and bull terriers). Pit-bull owners must register their dog with Dillon Police. If the dog is walked within the city limits it must be on a four to five foot leash. A fence is also required and any owner that violates the new ordinance could face fines, legal charges up to a misdemeanor and the dog could even be put to sleep.
- Lancaster County is working on a vicious dog ordinance. Breed specific language was taken out of the ordinance. Last vote will be taken next month. Orange Co, NC - Orange County proposes to limit the time a dog can be tethered to 3 hours out of a 24-hour period. In addition, the county is regulating kennel sizes; 1-35 pound dog must have 80 sq.ft. PER DOG; 36-75 pounds must have 100 sq.ft. PER DOG; 76 pounds and up 120 sq.ft. PER DOG. In order to keep a second dog in the kennel, an additional 50 percent of space must be added. Hearing on this was 5/20/2008, I have not heard of the outcome, but will continue to research it.

Subject: keep an eye on your dogs for this illness

Please share with all. This came to me from the vise president of our rescue group who lives in WI. Margie, kindly send out to all on out contact list. Thanks, Terry

Please be aware of a health alert that has affected two Humane Societies in Wisconsin. The disease started as outbreaks in Las Vegas and Miami Florida and is now in Waukesha Wisconsin. The illness is called streptococcus equi zooepidemicus and is caused by a bacteria. It can be treated by penicillan or amoxycillan if caught within the first hours of symptoms. The shelter was able to successfully treat 2 extremely ill dogs, and currently are treating all of the dogs with anitibiotics as a preventative.

It is unknown how illness is spread. In Waukesha, they had 7 dogs die from an extremely fast moving illness. It initially presents as kennel cough, but rapidly leads to high fevers -- 106 or 107, labored breathing and then death. From start to finish it's about 10 hours -- which is very scary. Dogs who were seemingly heathy are deathly ill and then dead by the next day.

Tissue samples were sent to the state lab, necropsys was done on 2 dogs, and samples were sent to other labs throughout the US before it was diagnosed.

I was informed today that kennel cough is making it's way through Chicago area boarding facilities and doggie parks. Keep an eye on your dogs.
